The Battle's Over Working Group seeks the approval for the Finance and Asset Management Committee and full Town Council regarding putting on some additional events to commemorate the end of WWI, one of the most violent conflicts in Human History.
	Proposals & Costings Firstly, we would like to donate some books to both the Primary & Secondary Schools, as WWI is an important part of both schools History Curriculum and these will be a valuable resource for pupils' study as well their own extracurricular interest. All books come recommended by the Department for Culture Media & Sport consisting of 10 books with a split of six Primary and four for Secondary. After researching the books, we have found that they are available, most cheaply from Amazon, and we would like £100.00 for this to include any postages costs.
	We are also proposing some competitions for the Primary School particularly, where the children could create their own "Your Country Needs You" style poster as in line with the guidelines from Department for Culture, Media & Sport. We would like to get the prizes from the Royal Mint who have a commemorative coin in a display case for £10.00 (https://www.westminstercollection.com/p-549N/UK-2018-WWI-Armistice-2-Pound-BU-Pack.aspx?sn=f) as this raises money for their charity whilst providing good quality prizes for the children who have taken part. Costs of £70.00 as £10.00 per prize and one donated to the school to keep. The winners will be displayed on Saturday November 10 th in the Corr Exchange. Cllr Hill will be speaking to Carl Lichfield, Head teacher for Much Wenlock Primary to organise this next week.
	We also request a CD with music from WWI, which has Songs and DVD from WW1 to be played in the Corn Exchange on Saturday 10 th November. We would like to display the winning posters from the Competition as well as some Yarn Poppies made by the local care homes to support a good focal point with the Much Wenlock Poppy Appeal. We have found the CD & DVD on Amazon for £9.17 and seek approval for this; we believe it will provide a thoughtful but upbeat atmosphere, where we request the Mayor to be in full regalia to present the prizes for the Competition.
	Finally, we would like to submit a proposal to light up Holy Trinity Church as in the attached quote. We think this will act as a stunning focal point with the church's location in the town and its cultural relevance within it. Within that Quote; we have an option for £300 and £500 and would like you to consider the £500 option for it to be lit up for a week with ideally alternating between the Soldier Silhouette & Poppy Symbol (if possible).

The Town Council has already approved to donate a casing for the long history of our Local WWI servicemen which will display a book of these details in Holy Trinity Church and it is important to note this, but it has already been approved and commissioned.

The Town Council also bought two Silent Solider Silhouettes for display in the Town which will serve as reminder of the events and be a focal point for any tourists and of course residents walking around the Town to be displayed by the church wall and top of high-street. Similarly, the Town Council displays plastic poppies on the lampposts around the town and this will be continued again this year and will be a regular fixture for the town. The group is also working to get poppies made by the Wheatland's care home and Lady Forrester Nursing home for display at points around the town, Councillor Kate Southan has been instrumental in getting this sorted. We believe that both places will be donating their own yarn for this and therefore we are grateful for their contribution and look forward to displaying them around the town.

Councillor Hill, through the Friends of the Cemetery working group, has organised Wreath laying for Friday the 10th of November. Some children from Much Wenlock Primary School
