This financial year (2016/2017) the Town Council has awarded the charity a grant of £6,000 and the charity is now responsible for its own expenditure, therefore all income and expenditure will be accounted for independently from the Town Council. However, this year's budget was based on projected income of £5,000 from Wenlock Estates which is worth £6,250 if gift aided. Unfortunately, only £2,500 has been received to date and this was received and included in last year's budget. William Brookes School is being charged £3,000 in this financial year for school use and there will be income due from the Cricket Club and the Bowling Club of circa £1,800.

If the income from Wenlock Estates is not received this reduces the budgeted income to £4,300 but with the grant of £6,000 from the Town Council this increases the projected income to £10,300. The budgeted income does not include any income from the Cricket Club because at the time the budget was drafted the Town Council was still in discussions with Shropshire Council concerning the transfer of the youth club building and the pavilion. The Town Council had agreed that, if the Cricket Club maintained the pavilion to a reasonable standard, they would not be charged for use of the ground.

With the money presently held in the bank, and if there is no additional expenditure other than that projected, the charity should have sufficient funds to break even this financial year.
